An introduction to your futures mountain:

The futures mountain is your individual pathway to your future. This will encourage you to think about your interests, passions and skills, and how these could lead to your ideal career. You can use this page as a step-by-step guide on how to complete the individual sections of your mountain, but you can also look at our example on page 4. Turn to the next page to begin the activity!

1) My three favorite career options

First, think about the top of your mountain: what are your top three dream jobs? Complete the three columns with your ideas. Remember – think big!

You can now start completing your mountain, working from the bottom box up towards the top of the mountain.

What are my talents? What skills would I like to develop?

Think about some of your skills and talents – maybe you're a creative individual, or work really well as a team! Think back to those hobbies and interests, what skills might you have learnt by doing these? You could also take this opportunity to think about skills you would like to improve in the future.

What careers might I be interested in?

Use this section to think about the types of career industries or sectors you might be interested in. For example, you may be interested in the construction industry, the health sector or a job in media. You could also think about what you'd like your career to look like: Would you like a job outside? Would you like to work flexible hours?

What interests me? What motivates me?

Use this section to think about what interests you. Examples could include any hobbies, clubs or extra-curricular activities you take part in, or school subjects that you enjoy! Think: what makes you lose track of time?



Take a look at the values below and rank them from 1 to 14, with 1 being your **most** important value, and 14 being your **least** important value.






















